FUN IOWA DESTINATIONS

MAKOKE TRAIL

Pronounced "Mah-ko-kay," twentytwo sites were selected to represent some of the region's best birding opporunites, all within a 30-40 minute drive Des Moines.

O2 KATE SHELLEY: BOONE HISTORY CENTER

Travel lowa's Scenic Byways and visit the site of Kate Shelly's bravery. In 1881, she helped save train locomotive crew members after the crash of the Des Moines River Bridge.

73 TREE IN THE ROAD, BRAYTON

Visit Audubon County along the East Nishnabotna River to view this stunning cottonwood tree that stands at almost exactly 100 feet.

04 GHOST TOWN: CARROLLTON

Located in Carroll County, Carrollton used to be the county seat. Unfortunately, the Northwestern Railroad bypassed it in 1867 and the county seat was moved to Carroll.
