- 18-inch wire wreath form
- 45 clothespins
- 1 container of paint (2 fl oz) in white OR blue
- 1 burlap ribbon
- 1 string of twine
- 1 length of rope
- Assortment of seashells

- Foam paint brush
- Hot glue gun
- Hot glue
- Scissors

Instructions

Paint Clothespins

- · Paint clothespins in selected color. To avoid painting shut, be sure to open them halfway through drying process.
- You may also opt to use unpainted clothespins for a natural wood look.

Arrange Clothespins

Arrange clothespins on the wire wreath.

- 1. Clip clothespin so that the bottom of the pin aligns with the last rung of the wreath (see white clothespins in photo).
- 2. Clip next clothespin so that the bottom hangs below the last wrung of the wreath and the large hole in the clothespin is secured around the last rung of the wreath (see blue clothespins in photo).
- 3. Repeat until wreath is covered.

Glue on Rope

• Glue the rope in a circle on top of your clothespins around your wreath using your glue gun. Be sure to glue the two ends together where you plan to place your bow.









Create and Attach Bow

- Fold the burlap ribbon into three sections (see photo).
- Pinch the sections together in the middle.
- Use your twine to wrap around the center of your ribbon a few times, then secure with a knot in the back and cut extra twine.
- Glue bow over exposed ends of rope using your glue gun.







Arrange and Glue Shells

- Arrange shells on your wreath in your preferred pattern.
- Glue them onto the wreath using a glue gun.
- You may opt to use a small shell for the middle of your bow.
