The Perry Public Library Board of Trustees met in regular session on Thursday, June 8, 2023, at 8 a.m. Note: This meeting was held in-person at the Perry Public Library.

Board members Kendall Rathje, Margaret Ruggle, and Heather Karolus were present. Library Director Mary Murphy and Deputy Library Director Misty VonBehren were also present.

Library Board member Kendall Rathje called the meeting to order.

Agenda – Margaret Ruggle moved to approve the agenda with Heather Karolus seconding the motion. MCU.

Minutes — Heather Karolus moved to approve the amended minutes from the May 11, 2023, meeting and Margaret Ruggle seconded the motion. MCU.

Financial Statements – Gift Fund receipts and payments were presented with receipts totaling \$5,478.95 and checks #6441- #6463, totaling \$7,508.04. The City of Perry Library Fund Status Report was reviewed. Heather Karolus moved to approve the financial reports with Margaret Ruggle seconding the motion. MCU.

Unfinished Business:

Director Search – The position was posted on June 1, 2023 and will close on June 30, 2023.

New Business:

Perry Public Library Foundation Request – Margaret Ruggle moved to ask the Perry Public Library Foundation for the remaining \$9,800 of FY23 funding and request that the entire \$35,000 of FY24 funding be allocated equally each month of FY24 (\$35,000 / 12 = \$2916 each month) with Heather Karolus seconding. Librarian's Report

The 2023 KidsFest was well attended, we estimate that the total attendance was 750-800. We have received a lot of positive feedback about this event.

The BEAM Projector was installed last week and is being used in children's programming. Summer Reading is off to great start with 373 registering for the children's program, 61 for teen program, and 90 for the adult program.
