The Perry Public Library Board of Trustees met in regular session on Thursday, May 12, 2022, at 8 a.m. Note: This meeting was held in-person in the Board Room at the Perry Public Library.

Board members Margaret Ruggle, Kendall Rathje, Mark Miller, Heather Karolus, and Rosa Gonzalez were present. Library Director Mary Murphy and Deputy Director Misty VonBehren were also present.

Board President Mark Miller called the meeting to order.

Deputy Director Misty VonBehren presented a program on Mentoring at the Spring Iowa Small Library Association meeting held virtually on May 6, 2022.

The KidsFest (June 4) attractions have been booked: bubbles, foam cannon, balloon twister, dunk tank, and petting zoo. Activities are being planned: Rotary with their putting green, HH@CLM activities include quill writing, PPL is planning an activity to make boats and evaluate their floatability, a duck pond, and more. The Perry Volunteer Fire Department are grilling their signature pork tenderloins for sandwiches and hot dogs. I have donations of pork loins from Tyson, bottles of water from Fareway, and hamburger and hot dog buns coming from HyVee. We will be purchasing single serving bags of chips and single serving granola bars for the rest of lunch. Lunch is \$1 and will be a Perry Volunteer Fire Department fundraiser. All Department and Assistant/Deputy Department Heads participated in the meeting. More than 135,000 companies use this EOS system.

Director Murphy and two Hometown Heritage at the Carnegie Library Museum employees attended an all-day training on April 26, 2022, to become certified as tour guides. The training was sponsored by lowa Tourism and lowa State University Extension and Outreach.

Health & Safety Policy

Safety Policy

- a. It is the policy of the Library to make every effort to provide healthful and safe working conditions for all of its employees. The Library expects employees to follow certain rules of conduct that will protect the interests of the Library and safety of all employees and members of the public.
- b. The Library has adopted the City of Perry Safety Manual. Employees must read, maintain their knowledge, and follow the safety rules as described in the City of Perry Safety Manual at all times.

Employee Responsibilities, Reporting

- a. Employees are responsible for conducting their work activities in a manner that is protective of their own health and safety, as well as that of other employees.
- b. Employees must immediately report every on-the-job accident, no matter how minor, to the organization (currently Company Nurse at 1-888-770-0928) designated by the City's workman's compensation insurance company, and to his or her supervisor or to the Director / Deputy Director.
- c. Employees shall immediately report to their supervisor or to the Director / Deputy Director any conditions that in their judgment may possibly threaten the health and safety of employees or the public.
- d. Employees are encouraged to make suggestions to their supervisor or the Director / Deputy Director of improvements that would make the Library work place safer or more healthful.

Weapons Policy

- a. While at work, on Library property, or while performing Library business off Library premises, Library personnel shall not carry or possess any weapons.
- b. No weapons shall be transported, carried, or stored in any City-owned vehicle at any time when conducting Library business.
- c. For the purposes of this policy the term "weapons" includes all firearms (including pellet guns), fixed blade knives having a blade longer than 3 inches, and any object, device, or instrument which is intended to be used to inflict physical injury or death (e.g. martial arts devices, blowguns, cross bows, etc.).

Violence in the Workplace

- a. The Library is committed to a safe, healthy, productive workplace for all employees. Our policy is to maintain a work environment which is free from intimidation, harassment, threats, and hostile or violent acts of any kind. To that end, the following conduct is prohibited:
 - 1. Threatening, intimidating, or hostile behavior of any kind directed towards any employee or director.
 - 2. Verbal or physical abuse of any employee or directors, including any form of assault.
 - 3. Vandalism, arson, or any other act against an employee or director and which is detrimental to the safety and welfare of such person or of their personal property, or of Library property.
- b. Violation of this policy may result in disciplinary action up to and including termination.
- c. Managers and supervisors have a responsibility to report any instance of inappropriate conduct (as defined above), or any concerns about potential violent behaviors or situations involving specific employees to their direct supervisor. This includes (i) any domestic relations situation which may involve a potential threat to the safety of the employee or others while at work or on duty; and (ii) any situation involving a customer, vendor, property owner, or other person with whom the Library may have a business relationship which may involve a potential threat to the safety of employee or directors regardless of whether at work or on duty. In addition, the incident may warrant immediate notification of the appropriate law enforcement agency.
- **d.** Employees who believe they have been subjected to, have observed, or have knowledge of any violation of this policy or of any potentially violent situation (including threats of violence) have a responsibility to report the behavior or incident immediately to their supervisor.
- **e.** Any employee who considers himself or herself to be in imminent danger of physical harm from any person should directly contact law enforcement officials immediately, and notify their supervisor.
- **f.** All complaints, notifications, and threats will be taken seriously and investigated promptly. Based on the outcome of the investigation, appropriate disciplinary action, up to and including termination, may be taken. Confidentiality will be maintained as appropriate.
