The Perry Public Library Board of Trustees met in regular session on Thursday, June 9, 2022, at 8 a.m. Note: This meeting was held in-person in the Board Room at the Perry Public Library.

Board members Margaret Ruggle, Kendall Rathje, Mark Miller, Heather Karolus, and Rosa Gonzalez were present. Library Director Mary Murphy and Deputy Director Misty VonBehren were also present.

Board President Mark Miller called the meeting to order.

Agenda – Heather Karolus moved to approve the agenda with Margaret Ruggle seconding the motion. MCU.

Minutes – Kendall Rathje moved to approve the minutes from the May 12, 2022, meeting, and Heather Karolus seconded the motion. MCU.

Financial Statements – Gift Fund receipts and payments were presented with receipts totaling \$2,473.40 and 23 checks, #6207 - #6235, totaling \$7,659.54. The City of Perry Library Fund Status Report was reviewed. Kendall Rathje moved to approve the financial reports with Heather Karolus seconding the motion. MCU.

New Business:

End of Fiscal Year 2021-2022 - Director Murphy reported on the budget.

Director Review – Director Mary Murphy will send out a self-evaluation to each Board member. Each Board member will add their comments and send to Board President Mark Miller. President Mark Miller will meet with Director Mary Murphy to review comments.

Board Education – The Library has received notification that it is accredited for the next three fiscal years, July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2025. Community Outreach and its funding was also discussed.

Librarian's Report:

Mission:

Enabling our community to thrive by offering lifelong opportunities to connect, learn, and create.

The KidsFest 2022 Oceans of Possibilities included bubbles, a foam cannon, a balloon twister, a dunk tank, and a petting zoo. Activities included: Rotary with their putting greens, HH@CLM activities with paper quilting, PPL with creating boats and evaluating their floatability along with a duck pond, and more. The Perry Volunteer Fire Department grilled their signature pork tenderloins for sandwiches and hot dogs. Tyson has donated three boxes of pork loins, Fareway donated bottles of water, and HyVee donated hamburger and hot dog buns. We purchased single serving bags of chips and single serving granola bars for the rest of lunch. Lunch is \$1 and was a Perry Volunteer Fire Department fundraiser. The fundraiser revenue was \$738. The KDLS van was here and broadcasted live from the event.

Director Murphy and two Hometown Heritage at the Carnegie Library Museum employees were evaluated on their Tour Guide skills on June 7, 2022. This evaluation follows the all-day training attended on April 26, 2022, to become certified as tour guides. Iowa Tourism and Iowa State University Extension and Outreach sponsors the training and certification. Everyone passed their certification and received a certificate proclaiming that they are Certified Professional Guides.

Summer Reading Program registration started on Monday, May 23rd. A bilingual flier was sent out in the May water bill followed by PSAs to all media outlets along with social media blasts. The theme this year is "Oceans of Possibilities."

PERRY PUBLIC LIBRARY RECEIVES ACCREDITATION FROM THE STATE LIBRARY OF IOWA

DES MOINES—The State Library of Iowa has announced that the Perry Public Library has met the conditions for state accreditation as outlined in "In Service to Iowa: Public Library Standards Sixth Edition."

Achieving accreditation requires a significant, ongoing local commitment to high quality library services. The Perry Public Library has been recognized for its efforts in all areas of library operations including governance and funding, staffing, library collection, services, public relations, access, and facilities. The accreditation status begins July 1, 2022, and is valid through June 30, 2025.

"The director and board of trustees of the Perry Public Library and the city of Perry are to be commended for this achievement and their commitment to excellence in public library services for their community," said State Librarian Michael Scott.

Of Iowa's 543 public libraries, 403 – including the Perry Public Library – are accredited. Iowa's accredited public libraries are recognized for being responsive to their communities and for exhibiting excellence in their provision of library services. More than two-thirds of all Iowans have active public library cards. Iowa libraries play key roles in workforce and economic development, lifelong learning and e-government activities. Iowans use their libraries to find jobs, do homework, locate a good book to read, research medical conditions, access government information, and more.

Accredited libraries receive a higher rate of compensation through the State Library's Enrich lowa program. They also receive a Certificate of Accreditation signed by Governor Kim Reynolds, Lieutenant Governor Adam Gregg, State Librarian Michael Scott, and Iowa Commission of Libraries Chairperson Carrie Falk.

Perry Public Library - A Year in Review: Fiscal Year 2020-2021

It seems surreal when we look back over the past two and half years. Did we really do all that because of a pandemic? Yes! YES! We did! We came through all of it with a determination to serve our community with the best library services possible given the circumstances. We now have new words in our vocabulary - reopening, contagion, pivot (one I as soon forget!), social distancing, super spreader event to name a few.

What was accomplished as we came out of the Pandemic - July 1, 2021, to the present, June 14, 2022

- 1. In July 2021, we finished a socially distanced Summer Reading Program with 86 Adults, 14 Teens, and 225 children registered. We still had zoom programs with one in-person program off-site. We packaged kits and program materials to be picked up at the library.
- 2. In FY2021-2022 we added one Little Free Library at the following locations Perry Elementary School, Perry Middle School, Little Free Board Book Library at the east door of the Perry Public Library, the laundromat on First Street, and the Perry Food Pantry. The original Little Free Library is now located at Fareway, then we added the four nursing homes Eden Acres (Rowley), Spring Valley, the Lutheran Home, Aspire (Pearl Valley), and then added those at community gathering places --- the Perry Perk, Hamlin Bell residence, and McCreary Recreation Center. We had one at Dallas County Hospital, but the pandemic caused that one to be shut down. We relocated that one to the Perry Food Pantry. The total number of Perry Little Free libraries that we stock and maintain is now 13.
- 3. The State Library District Consultant Maryann Mori led the Library Staff and Board through a strategic planning process to first conduct a community survey and summarize how best the library should serve the community. A five-year Strategic Plan was created from the community survey.
- 4. An Accreditation Process was initiated in the fall of 2021 with a review of all library policies. Our application was submitted in February 2022. We just received notification that the Perry Public Library is accredited at the highest level from July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2025.
- 5. The official date of reopening the library to the public was February 17, 2021. We slowly moved furniture back into the library but with many social distancing practices in place. In-person programming resumed in September 2021 with the option of a virtual programming. As we moved into the new year, we moved back to normal hours and normal in-person programming.
- 6. We received an American Rescue Plan Act grant of \$5,000 to fund new and more security cameras. We went from 14 cameras to 18, most on the outside of the building. The resolution on the new cameras is amazing.
- 7. Discussions were initiated in the fall of 2021 for a partnership between the City of Perry, Hometown Heritage, and the Perry Public Library. A Memorandum of Understanding was approved by the Hometown Heritage Board, the Perry Public Library Board, and the Perry City Council that outlines the respective responsibilities of reopening Hometown Heritage at the Carnegie Library Museum (HH@CLM) on January 4, 2022. HH@CLM has been open six days a week since its reopening date until summer hours started on Memorial Day weekend.
- 8. We have continued the Food Recovery programs (making food available that would be thrown away) as well as the Food Outreach programs (giving produce away in the Healthy Steps program with the goal of encouraging the addition of fresh produce into diets to become a healthy food habit and working toward a healthier body.) Director Murphy has made five presentations at two

- lowa Health conferences, the Iowa Library Association conference, and ISU Extension and Outreach Food System Conference about the Food Recovery program.
- 9. The Library digitized the Perry High School Yearbooks. They are available online and can be accessed anywhere there is an internet connection.
- 10. We will be holding a Staff Retreat on June 20, 2022, with the goal of building of excellent communication among staff, promoting our role in the community, what to do in emergency situations, and updating our first aid training and CPR certificates.
- 11. We planned and sponsored the Oceans of Possibilities KidsFest on June 4, 2022. Attendance has been estimated from 750 900, possibly as high as 1000. This event kicked off a fully in-person Summer Library program for 2022. At this date, we have over 400 children, 28 teens, and 78 adults registered.
- 12. The street level of the library was repainted with the upper story scheduled to be painted in the
- 13. New professional signage was installed throughout the library making all the signage uniform in appearance.
- 14. All window blinds were taken down and replaced by new shades.
- 15. Grants used in FY2021-2022
 - a. The last \$6,000 of the Cares Act grant of \$12,400 was used to buy books to give away to increase access to books for Perry students during the pandemic.
 - b. 4RKids funding of \$500 was used for the Little Board Book Library.
 - c. ARPA Grant of \$5,000 to update security camera system
 - d. State Historical Society of Iowa, Inc. grant of \$7,500 for new programming series: Reawakening History by Telling Our Own Stories
 - e. Arts Midwest and Art on the Prairie grant of \$2,500 for new programming series: Reawakening History by Telling Our Own Stories
 - f. Arts Council of Iowa: ARPA Grant funding of \$18,000 for wages for Hometown Heritage employees
 - g. Art Council of Iowa: ARPA grant funding of \$16,500 for program series: Reawakening History by Recording Our Own Stories
 - h. Bock Grant of \$1,200 to help fund Oceans of Possibilities KidsFest 2022
 - i. 4RKids funding of \$500 to pay for Board Books in the Little Free Board Book Library
 - j. Kwik Star funding of \$1,000 to go towards buying Prize books and books for the Little Free Libraries at the schools
 - k. Farm Credit of America grant of \$1,500 to add milk and eggs to the library Food Recovery program
 - Farm Credit of America grant of \$2,000 to go towards the Healthy steps program at the Perry Farmers Market
 - m. Tyson Foods grant of \$10,000 to go towards the Healthy steps program at the Perry Farmers market
 - n. In FY2021-2022, total grant funding of \$72,200 was used to leverage the Library's Wiese funding to serve our community.
- 16. We are back to pre-covid activity in programming, service, and room use. Our Door Count is improving monthly, see Board Overview.
