PERRY PUBLIC LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES May 9, 2024 Minutes

The Perry Public Library Board of Trustees met in regular session on Thursday, May 9, 2024 at 8:00 a.m.

Board members Kendall Rathje, Margaret Ruggle, Rosa Gonzalez, Mark Miller, and Heather Karolus were present. Friends' of the Library President Kathy Miller and Library Director Misty VonBehren were also present.

Library Board President Mark Miller called the meeting to order.

Agenda – Kendal Rathje moved to approve the agenda with Rosa Gonzalez seconding the motion. MCU.

Minutes – Margaret Ruggle moved to approve the minutes from the April 11, 2024 meeting and Rosa Gonzalez seconded the motion. MCU.

Financial Statements – Gift Fund receipts and payments were presented with receipts from the period of April 11, 2024 – May 7, 2024 totaling \$3003.05 and checks #6582 - #6598, totaling \$6563.16. The City of Perry Library Fund Status Report and the April City of Perry Library Claims Report were reviewed. Heather Karolus moved to approve the financial reports with Rosa Gonzalez seconding the motion. MCU.

New Business – Board member terms were reviewed. Two trustee terms [Mark Miller and Heather Karolus] are set to expire at the end of the fiscal year [June 30, 2024]. It was discussed to promote to the community the opportunity to serve on the board. Director VonBehren will promote it both internally and externally to gather a wide range of potential candidates. New terms will begin on July 1, 2024. The process is for the mayor to appoint a trustee to a 4-year term with the city council approval of the appointment. Trustees must live within Perry, according to the ordinance.

Librarian Report:

On Wednesday, April 17, Director VonBehren and Museum Librarian Candi Coffin attended the Hometown Heritage biannual meeting. Our goal will be to partner with additional entities and organizations to offer exhibits of a historical nature. The group is also seeking nominations for the 2024 inductee for the Wall of Witnesses in Soumas Court. Deadline for nominations is May 15, 2024. Forms are available online, at the Perry Public Library, and the Carnegie Library Museum.

Library Staff are finalizing plans for the summer program Adventure Begins at Your Library and KidsFest which will be held on Saturday June 1st. We will experience a staffing shortage at the end of May and beginning of June due to health reasons.

Current library staff will pick up additional duties relating to summer library programming. In addition, the Friends of the Library will be providing volunteers for KidsFest.

On Thursday May 2, Director VonBehren attended the quarterly offsite city leadership meeting. This offers the opportunity for city department heads and administration to meet and concentrate on defining goals for the next quarter as a city. These meetings are always valuable and very productive in nature. It allows better communication and collaborations between city departments. The next meeting will be in August.

The week of May 6, the Public Works Department tore out and poured a new section of sidewalk and curb on the south side of the library. The funds for this project were allocated in the FY24 Capitals.

On Wednesday May 22, there will be a city staff meeting for all employees to provide an update on city projects. These are held on a quarterly basis.
